Request for trading halt: Westpac New Zealand Limited (NZX Code: WNZ)

We request a trading halt be applied to our financial products (WNZ1T2, WNZ2T2 and WNZHA) under NZX Listing Rule 9.9.1(a) and set out below details of the request as per the NZX rules.

We would like the trading halt to apply from the commencement of trading on the NZX debt market on Tuesday 5 May 2026.

Reasons for trading halt, including impact of event on fair, orderly or transparent markets:

WNZ's parent company Westpac Banking Corporation (**WBC**), intends to release its 2026 half year financial results and related documents (**Documents**) on ASX and then NZX on 5 May 2026 at around 9.30-10.00am NZ time (7.30-8.00am Sydney time). The trading halt is required because WNZ cannot release the Documents or its own financial results until it receives confirmation from WBC that the Documents have been released on ASX and NZX under WBC's ticker code.

Given the sequencing of release of WBC and WNZ announcements, we consider it appropriate that no trading occurs until release by WNZ of the relevant information, so that all market participants can trade on a fully informed basis.

How long we want the trading halt to last and why: Once the Documents have been released on ASX and NZX by WBC they will be released on NZX under the WNZ ticker code. We request the trading halt to last until the Documents have been released on NZX under the WNZ ticker code.

The event we expect to happen that will end the trading halt: The release of the Documents on NZX under the WNZ ticker code. Please end the trading halt after the release of the announcement titled "Westpac Group 2026 Half Year Results Documents".

PLEASE NOTE: We understand that WBC may also seek a trading halt. The end of the trading halt on NZX code WBC does not trigger the end of the trading halt on NZX code WNZ. The trading halt application by WBC is separate and is likely to end before the Documents have been released by WNZ.

We confirm that we are not aware of any reason why the trading halt should not be granted.
